PROGRAM RULES

In order for your children to participate in programs, we require the following to be returned to the front office:

- **A completed and signed Registration Form and Parent/Students Release form.**

Lakeview programs are very popular and spaces are limited. To ensure your child has a space, payment must be received promptly.

If spaces become full, payments will be returned to those registrations who did not fulfill one of the spots.

Please use the payment portal at www.lakeviewmontessori.ca under “admissions/payment”. All programs (with the exception of homework club) are to be paid online at the portal. Please leave a comment of which program you are paying for. Please be advised that homework club payments are to be paid directly to the staff (Ms. Diana and Ms. Troup) on a drop-in basis.

In order to ensure the smooth and safe execution of the programs we ask that the following rules be noted:

- In most cases, the price of the program assumes 1-2 classes will be cancelled as a result of inclement weather or teacher commitments.
- Generally, programs run from 3:30 until 4:30 unless otherwise indicated. If for any reason a program is cancelled (weather, etc.), every effort will be made to contact parents to notify them of the cancellation.
- Unless otherwise noted, parents will need to arrange transportation for programs that occur off campus. Please remember to collect your child(ren) on time.
- Children should be collected promptly once the program ends. If you are unable to collect your child, he/she/they will be kept safe and placed in our After School Care program, for which there will be a charge. Please note this service is not available for any program that ends after 6.00pm on a weekday or at any time on the weekend. This service is only available for Lakeview students.
- All programs operate on a first come first serve basis. Please note that priority will be given to Lakeview students. Non-Lakeview students interested in partaking in any after school programs will also need to hand in a health form and emergency contact to keep on file. *An additional \$50 will be charged to non-Lakeview students per session upon registration.



- Please note that when participating in the programs, students must adhere to the school code of conduct at all times. Failure to comply may jeopardize their position in the program.
- All program fees are non-refundable. Please be advised, if you decide to remove your child(ren) one week after sessions have begun, or are travelling during the sessions you are not entitled to receive any refunds nor deductions. Later registrations are expected to pay the full trimester rate.
- High school students from grades 9-12 are allowed to assist in a program for community service hours.
- Most programs will only run if a specific number of students enroll.

MONDAY



MATH CLUB (Mr. Mendez) Grade: 4-8
Venue: Middle School
Time: 3:30-4:30

Limited to: 20 students. Cost: \$25 - * Session 2

This Math Program will help build and advance your child's math skills, for an advantage in school and beyond. Starting with the mathematical foundations, your child will work at his or her own pace, mastering each new concept before moving on.

GREEN TEAM (Ms. Lauren) Grades: 1-6
Venue: Junior room
Time: 3:30-4:30

Limited to: 20 students. Cost: \$25 a session - * Session 1 & 3

If you are environmentally conscious, or if you would like to be more environmentally conscious this is the club for you. We will focus our time on green initiatives, recycling, upcycling, service learning, conservation, and habitat beautification all through games, cooking projects (like using a solar oven), and arts & crafts.

DRAMA CLUB (Mrs. Jessica Bennardo) Grade: 1-6
Venue: Junior room
Time: 3:30-4:30

Limited to: 15 students. Cost: \$10 - * Session 2

This fun club uses Drama games and activities to build children's confidence, communication skills, group awareness and creativity. Children will learn through play and make friends. In this semester Drama Club will prepare students for performance in the Promenade of the Arts taking place in April. Rehearsals and attending Drama club will be excellent preparation for those taking a role in the Promenade of the Arts.

BAND (Mr. Iosif) Grade: 4+
Venue: Music Room (Plaza)
Time: 3:30-4:30

Limited to: No limit. Cost: \$25 per session - * Sessions 2 and 3

Do you want to produce great music together? If you do, or you simply want to practice/learn a new instrument while having fun, come and join the Lakeview Band! Priority will be given to students with previous musical experience.

TUESDAY



ATHLETICS (Coach Mendez & Ms. Milena) Grade: 4-8
Venue: St. Marks Church Hall
Time: 3.30-4.30

Limited to: No limit. Cost: Free - * Sessions 1, 2 and 3

This is where future stars get their start! Covering various game strategy situations, defensive/offensive formations, nutrition and strength/conditioning/agility in addition to the basic skills noted above. DANCE II (Ms. Jill) Age: 5-7
Venue: Plaza Studio
Time: 4:30-5:30

Limited to: 10 students. Cost: \$50 - * Sessions 1, 2 and 3

Miss Jill brings your little one into a fun creative movement class with ballet basics, technique and exploration. Lots of dance, imagination games and a great starting place for building your little ones' knowledge of movement fundamentals. (Registration at Lakeview)

JAZZ DANCE (Ms. Jill) Age: 8-12
Venue: Plaza Studio
Time: 5.30-6.30

Limited to: 10. Cost: \$50 - Session 1, 2 & 3

Acrobatics in dance nowadays is typically the style of dance you see on Broadway, commercials, music videos and theatre. Taking its influence from many other dance forms, Jazz can be smooth, classical, sharp and aggressive, or lyrical. Each class consists of a quick warm up with conditioning and "across the floor" exercises, followed by specific acrobatic techniques and choreography.

FRENCH CLUB (Madame Swisterski) Age: 3+

Time: 3:30-4:00

Limited to: 12 students per session. Cost: \$10 per class - Session 1, 2 & 3

Our Club Francais has been running for a few years now and has been a very popular extension to our regular school French program. Through a variety of active games, funny songs, interesting books, cool crafts and more, the children enhance their knowledge of the language in a spontaneous and happy manner.

HANDBALL CLUB (Mr. Mendez) Grade: 1 - 8

Venue: Elementary Playground

Time: 12.00–12.30

Limited to: 12 students. Cost: Free - * Sessions 3

Handball is also known as Four Squares. The handball court is split into fours with the most prestigious position being the King, followed by the Queen, Jack and then the lowest rank, Duce. Players will master hitting the balls into their box first and then passing it to the next play. Does your child spend a lot of time during recess or pick up playing this game? Now they can join the handball club to have more fun, practice their hand to eye coordination, make friends by playing with younger or older students, invent and learn rules.

Time: 4.00-5.00

Limited to: No limits. Cost: \$10 per class - * Sessions 1, 2 and 3

Supervised homework in a classroom setting. The teachers will be available throughout the hour to help students with any work they are struggling with or any extra practice they need.



JAMBEAT I Age: 8+
Venue: Music Studio (Plaza)
Time: 5-6

Limited to :20 students. Cost: \$125 monthly - * Sessions 1, 2 and 3

Music technology is a fun, engaging part of music learning with endless potential for real-world application. Join us for our new course, focused on learning instruments through a video game designed by professional educators (Yousician) and creating beats on GarageBand. All levels of musical experience are welcome, and feel free to bring a friend to make some music with!

MANDARIN (Ms. Su) Age: 3+
Venue: Casa Room
Time: 3:30-4:00

Limited to: 10 students per session. Cost: \$10 per class - * Session 1, 2 & 3

Support your child in moving towards that coveted goal of good communication in more than one language. You will find it easy to pick up a language when it is geared towards children's comprehension. Come and join in the Mandarin fun and games!

ART CLUB (Ms. Heather)
Venue: Art Studio (Plaza)
Time: 3:30-4:45 – Wednesdays (twice a month – dates are listed)

Limited: 10 students per session. Cost: \$25 a session with a first come and first serve sign-up.

The after-school art program is aimed to help its members explore and develop their skills in various art subjects such as photography, crafts, painting, and drama. During these sessions, Ms. Heather Taylor will not only be teaching members about the arts, but encouraging students to express themselves with deeper meaning, and broaden their range of artistic abilities.

**Please be advised that the following Art Club lessons are subject to change based on student feedback.*

Photography Club (“Falling in love with Fall-tography!”)
October: 18th and 25th

Limitations: Open to Junior R, Intermediates and Seniors / commitment to both weeks

Students must sign up for both sessions at the cost of \$25 per session. Both sessions will explain, in depth, the elements of photography, and how to take amazing photos. Using applications and filters, your child will have the opportunity to jump behind the lens and photograph. They will catch a glimpse of what professional photography entails, the challenges, the joys, and of course, discover how much more beautiful the Fall season is behind the lens!

Salt and Silhouettes Club (“Getting Silly with Silhouettes”)
November 15th and 29th

Limitations: all Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors (10 student limitation and must sign up for both dates)

This session will focus on the element of shape in visual arts. Students will have the chance to see what Ms. Heather loves to do on her spare time. Salt art! Students will have the opportunity to create images using salt on



black bristles and learn the concepts of 'temporary' art, and what it means to take in the moment at its best. We will preserve their work through photographs, and students will have the chance to sign up for two major sessions. Students will also learn visual concepts, and vocalize to their club members what their piece means to them.

Holiday Crafts ("Merry Craft-mas!")

December 13th and 20th

Limitations: Open for Juniors, Intermediates and Senior students. Students can choose which date they would like (preferably both)

This session will focus on holiday crafts! Using colour, shape and texture to create beautiful holiday décor.

Painting Club ("Colour Me Beautifully" POP ART)

January 17th and 31st

Limitations: Open to Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors

In honour of MLK's birthday, students will have the opportunity to gather with group members to paint images of Martin Luther King Junior. Students will address how 'pop' art can leave a bold expression on what Martin Luther King did for society. Combining his legacy and pop art elements (complimentary colours and shape lesson) will leave students with a stronger impression on why art expression matters! Pop art will therefore be done at its very finest!

Graffiti and Poetry ("Love and Poetry")

February 14th

Limitations: Intermediates and Seniors only

Valentine's day is about expressing how you feel about that special someone. Despite the ups and downs, Valentine's day is a day of LOVE! This after school session will focus on combining poetry and graffiti paintings to express how real LOVE is. Graffiti is a bold and colourful statement, while poetry is a verbal one. So, why not combine both? This session will be an interesting combination of sharing ideas, rhyme, and graffiti art done on large sheets of bristle.

Quilting ("Free at Last, Free at Last, let's create Freedom Quilts!")

February 28th

Limitations: Junior Classes only

This session will focus on the art and meaning of freedom quilts. Patterns and colours will come together to create not only beautiful images, but meaningful ones which tell the story of local Black Canadians. This session will honour Black History Month and teach your child to beautifully use colours and shapes inspired by our ancestors.



Painting ("Marching into Spring!")
March 21st and 28th

Limitations: Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors

To celebrate the first days of Spring, Ms. Heather will teach specific techniques to create awesome Expressionism pieces with acrylic paints on professional canvases. Combining the elements of colours, space,

and value, students will relax and paint to end their day. Ms. Heather will encourage them to paint how they feel while welcoming in the new season.

Photography ("Welcome Back Photographers! Wishing for RAIN!")
April 18th and 25th

Limitations: Seniors only

As the sun breaks through after the cooler season, students will have the opportunity to learn further elements in photography, (lighting and the rule of 3), and how to take amazing photos without spending thousands of dollars. Combining technology and art, here we have Ms. Heather's secrets on how to create beautiful images behind the lens. Get ready to explore the budding trees, fresh flowers, and puddles through the eye of your lens. Both sessions are surely something to look forward to!

Drama/Poetry/Painting/Photography ("Open Art Studio!")
May 16th and 30th

Limitations: Both sessions are open to Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors – (again, 10 students with a first come first serve sign up, 2 or 3 students per category)

As we begin to close out the school year, it's only appropriate to show off what you did best in the arts. Both sessions are geared as a free portfolio session. Students can choose a painting station, photography stations, poetry station or a Drama one. The idea is to create the busiest studio during the busiest time of year! Students must bring their ideas beforehand, so that Ms. Heather can prepare numbers and materials. Choices must be within the limits of what was presented during the school year. Both sessions will collaborate a strong combination ranging from dramatic to visual arts. Let's end the year after school program with a BANG!

Venue: Arrowsmith Room

Time: 3:30-4:30

Limited to: No limit Cost: \$25 per session –* Session 1, 2 & 3

The students would be able to request homework assistance from the teacher and complete work in a place that is fully resourced and quiet.

GLEE CLUB (Mrs. Stein) Grade: 1-8

Venue: Music Room (Plaza)

Time: 3.30-4.30

Limited to: 20 students. Cost: \$25 - * Session 3

This a fun and dynamic program that allows your child to be creative in many ways. Learn about stage performance, vocal harmonization and projection. The genres of music will be pop/rock/music theatre, while integrating choreography. Collaboration with other students and the instructor will lead to interesting song mash-ups while studying of music/dance from different time frames. An exciting live performance for friends and family will end our session!

Venue: Robotics Room (Plaza) Time: 3:30-4:30

Limited to: 20. Cost: \$25 - * Session 1 - BEGINS SEPT. 15, 2017

Students will have the opportunity to design, construct and share lego creations with guidance and collaboration. A favourite activity of many children, this club will foster creativity in our future architects, engineers and designers! Create! Design! Invent! Use recyclable materials to create design and invent. Learn the stages of design and showcase your designs at the end of each session.

S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) (Ms. Troup) Grade: 6+
Venue: Middle School. Time: 3:30-5.00

Limited to: 16. Cost: \$100 - * Feb 9- April 27.

The STEM Club focuses on fostering the natural curiosity kids have for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The students will do several individual and team experiments, as well as, study 8 different subject areas: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science, Astronomy, Mathematics, Technology and Engineering. This is a team program so students will form teams of 3 -4 participants. These teams will then be invited to participate in the Let's Talk Science Challenge hosted at the University of Windsor at the beginning of May (date to be announced still). Teams will create a name, fun costumes and team shirts to show their team spirit on challenge day!

The Let's Talk Science Challenge is a team-based competitive enrichment event offered for Grades 6-8 students by Let's Talk Science Outreach volunteers across Canada. This fun-filled program gives students the opportunity to build their team skills, interact with relevant role models and test their abilities against peers.

Along with the competition, shirts and STEM challenge materials, a snack will be served along with juice in each session.

GARDENING CLUB (Mrs. Swisterski) Grades: PreK-Grade 6
Venue: Elementary Garden, Time: 11.15-11:45

Limited to: 10 students Cost: free - * Sessions 1, 2 and 3

We'll experiment in the garden with pretty flowers and fast growing herbs and veggies to learn about how new plants start and what plants need to grow and thrive. We'll learn where our food comes from and, hopefully, we'll produce what we need to make a simple salad.

CULINARY CLUB (Ms. Troup) Grades: 7+
Venue: Middle School Kitchen, Time: 11.00-12.30

Limited to: 20 students Cost: \$100 for all sessions - * Sessions 1, 2 and 3

Calling all Senior students who would like to learn how to cook or work on learning some new skills in the kitchen. Each week we will prepare and/or cook something new from around the world, it may be a soup from Spain or a dessert from Australia. You will have the opportunity to help decide the following week's menu.
